
Frameworks Community Development Corporation

Advance America continues to partner with Austin, Texas-based Frameworks CDC to provide a series of financial literacy workshops on topics such as basic budgeting, the importance of saving and consumer credit options. These free workshops offer participants an opportunity

to receive one-on-one financial coaching from a Frameworks CDC representative. Workshops help foster healthy personal financial choices by providing families with the knowledge and tools they need to make sound short- and long-term financial decisions.



Michigan Youth in Government

Advance America continues to sponsor MYIG, a program designed to stimulate interest in local, state and national government institutions and policies. The program provides middle and high school students with an opportunity to take on the roles of state legislators, lobbyists and lawyers, and to simulate all phases of the lawmaking process. As students debate and advocate on behalf of their "constituents," they gain a greater understanding of how government works, become more confident in voicing their opinions and learn how to engage with other leaders to make changes that benefit all people. Our support enables more than 200 inner-city youth to participate each year, and these participants are consistently selected by their peers to serve as legislative and judiciary leaders at MYIG conferences.

Winning Futures Mentoring

Advance America partners with Winning Futures, an award-winning non-profit organization that empowers youth to succeed through mentoring and strategic planning. They partner with high schools in metro Detroit to facilitate innovative mentoring sessions where they engage youth through trusting relationships with mentors, energizing experiences and unforgettable life lessons. Since 1994, 30,000 students have been impacted by Winning Futures.



Boys & Girls Clubs of Indianapolis

Advance America continues to sponsor Boys and Girls Clubs activities across America because the clubs offer a positive environment for youth development. The Francis Scott Key Club in Indianapolis provides services to extremely vulnerable, underprivileged youth in the city. Through the support of Advance America, this program provides a safe, educational and positive atmosphere where Francis Scott Key Elementary School students can prosper and reach their full potential.



Faith for Change

Advance America partners with Faith for Change to support the academic success of students in high-needs schools. Advance America supports the organization's "We Got Your Back" back-to-school campaign to provide school supplies to more than 400 high-need children, as well as the "New Future Initiative," which facilitates collaboration between houses of worship and community organizations to provide academic support programs to local children. Advance America works with West Angeles Community Development Corporation to provide free financial literacy and critical income tax preparation programs for low-income families and seniors.




Palmetto Family Council
